Find out about the Irish gangs, gangsters and gamblers who roamed the streets of Cleveland's near west side in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The McCart Street Gang of today's

West 69th Street terrorized family business owners and fellow residents alike in the 1890s. Then the gang morphed into "The Cheyennes"--newsboys and would-be boxers who were accused of involvement in the "Circulation Wars" between the Cleveland Plain Dealer and the Cleveland Leader-News circa 1914. The likes of notorious Cleveland racketeer "Black Jack" McGinty rose from the ranks of the Cheyennes in the aftermath of the Circulation Wars. Margaret Lynch, Executive Director of the Irish American Archives Society and Jim Dubelko, CSU historian, talk about some of Irish Cleveland's colorful characters.
