## 2019 Year in Review

Irish American Archives Society doesn't have a venue for hosting talks, so we work with host partners who are interested in cosponsoring talks and other kinds of presentations. Although we do not start the year with a slate of planned talks, our calendar fills up every year nonetheless. 2019 was no exception.

We worked with a particularly wide range of partnering organizations in 2019: The McNeeley Library and Forever Young groups of the West Side Irish American Club; the Padraic Pearse Library of the Irish American Club East Side; Roots of American Music, Ireland's Great Hunger Institute at Quinnipiac University; Cleveland's Irish Cultural Festival; the Baseball History Museum at League Park, the Irish American Law Society of Cleveland; the Achill Heritage Centre, and an informal genealogy group that meets at P.J. McIntyre's. Executive Director Margaret Lynch, IAAS Board President Tom Corrigan, and IAAS Board Member Kevin O'Toole gave talks, and we promoted talks by Mick Mulchrone of the Tiernaur Oral History Group (brought to Cleveland by Jack Kilroy); Tom Kelly of Baseball Ireland and Cleveland sports writer Dan Coughlin; and Vincent English of the Achill Heritage Centre. The subjects ranged from Irish immigration and landlords to Irish lawyers to Irish "Gangs, Gangsters, and Gamblers," among others.
